
'Social predators' 64×89 cm, recycled plastic, framed

Concept:

'Social predators' deeply explores themes of social relationships and mutual consumption. Using vivid images of crocodiles and biters, the artist conveys the essence of social predation—a phenomenon where individuals use each other to achieve their own interests. These two elements vividly illustrate how we can simultaneously be victims and predators in our interactions.

The central circular form in the composition serves as a powerful visual metaphor for closure and infinity. It reminds us that the cycle of social consumption and manipulation repeats from generation to generation, creating a closed system that is difficult to escape.







'Paradox of unity' 64×89 cm, recycled plastic, framed


Concept:

Concept:

'Drilled', a thought-provoking piece inspired by the artist's experience in a dental chair. Through the imagery of drills, people, and phones surrounding the central element—a tooth—the work conveys a sense of overwhelming irritation and heightened tension.

The composition captures that moment when everything feels invasive and annoying, mirroring the discomfort of being in a dental situation. The central tooth symbolizes vulnerability, while the surrounding elements represent external pressures that can wear down one's patience.

'Drilled' serves as a powerful commentary on modern life, reflecting how the incessant noise and demands from our surroundings can intensify our stress.

'Mangrove forest'




Concept:




'Feathers' D70 cm, recycled plastic, framed


'Frogs'

Squirrels can't be seen in the autumn forest. They race through peacefully I observe.






'Monkeys set' 77×48 cm, recycled plastic, framed, 2024

Fish in silence swim, gliding through light and shadow, unaware of rest. Their path reflects on still waves. In their silence there is a piece. In their movement, time flows on.






'Geckos' 35×46,5 cm, recycled plastic, framed, 2024

Dark sleep trembles near, curls weave with restless whispers - unease slowly grows.






'Spirals' 35×46,5 cm, recycled plastic, framed, 2024
